

MEASAT SUPPORTS WORLD CUP 2010

Kuala Lumpur, 20 May 2010 – MEASAT Satellite Systems Sdn. Bhd. ("MEASAT") announced today that it had signed an agreement with GlobeCast Asia to provide transponder capacity for the upcoming FIFA World Cup 2010 in South Africa.

The World Cup 2010, FIFA's premier international soccer tournament, is scheduled to take place between 11 June and 11 July 2010 in South Africa. This tournament will feature 32 countries playing a total of 64 matches.
